Introduction

I am Dalma Diczkó, I am currently studying at the Psychology Master's programme in Clinical and Health Psychology. I have been a student at the university since 2017, I also got my bachelor's degree here. I came to the capital from Nyíregyháza, where I studied at the Krúdy Gyula High School, and after a successful graduation, there was no question for me that I would like to complete my higher education here. I was already participating in the life of the community during my high school studies, I was a member of the Student Union there for 6 years. I definitely wanted to continue this kind of social life during my university studies, because I didn't know many of my student companions when I got here. However, at the Faculty of Education and Psychology, I learned very quickly that social life is an integral part of everyday faculty, so I applied to the Animator Circle without question. The experiences here, the programs, and the Animators themselves have given me a wonderful year as a freshman to which I think back with a smile to this day. During this time, I was able to experience many aspects of university citizenship, as there were countless opportunities for development, but I was faced with even more responsibilities, but I have always loved to claim a range of activities that extend in all directions as my own.

I joined the Student Union in January 2019, where I worked as an equal opportunities officer in the Student Welfare Committee. The job itself was not new to me, as I joined many volunteer organizations during my high school studies, where, similarly to my work here, we conducted fundraisers, helped people with special needs, and performed other charitable tasks. As an equal opportunities officer, I was able to see how strongly the members of the Student Unions actually represent their interests in their work. In the course of this, I got to know a lot of organizations in addition to the university and faculty unions, with which we were able to have long-term cooperation during my career in this position. I also managed to give a sensitization training to the Animators in training, which brought me closer to the world of people with special needs and could pass on information that could definitely help them in their everyday lives. This is where the responsibility for organizing a complete program came into my hands for the first time, because it was my responsibility to organize various faculty fundraisers and the Everyone Helps Day, which had become a tradition by then. In addition, I have carried out student welfare-related tasks that have also been incumbent on me, such as evaluating regular social support applications or any other activity that I have been able to help with the work of the Committee. Of course, we had a lot of ideas with the committee president about new programs, opportunities, and everything that could be used to continually improve our work.



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Half a year later, in May 2019, my committee president asked me to be the president of the Student Welfare Committee, which I accepted without thinking. I was honored to be invited, as it was not just a kind of feedback on the effectiveness of my work, but another job in which I saw plenty of personal development opportunities back then. It should be emphasized that I also had to experience management strategies here that were essential to my work, as I oversaw the work of an entire committee, consisting of the Equal Opportunities Officer and the Application Officer, in addition to having many other responsibilities as President. The management of the social benefits, the setting up of the evaluation committee and the transfer of knowledge and information were in my hands, and I also handled the one-time social benefits and basic benefits in full, which was a wide-ranging task that required great precision and attention. In my work, I have always given priority to student interests, and I have worked and fought for individual cases. As President of the Committee, I worked closely with the officials of the other faculties of Eötvös Loránd University and the University Student Social and Scholarship Committee, with whom we had monthly meetings. Here I could experience a lot about the operation of other faculties and how the work of a larger, more comprehensive organization is built within an institution. In addition to the social-based benefits, we also continuously developed our faculty applications in cooperation with the application officer, which we further developed together with the Faculty Scholarship Committee, of which I was president, and made them available to students. We wanted students to be able to apply for a benefit that rewards their past, or even future work, for their activities beyond their studies at the university. Thus, it was still possible to apply for our faculty's scientific, cultural and sports applications, as well as our demonstrator applications every semester. In addition, we considered it important to reward our students for their activities in public life, so we made available our One-Time Public Life Application every month, which our students really enjoyed taking advantage of. In the course of evaluating this, it has always come to my mind how diverse our program opportunities are, how many things the students here can participate in, and how diverse we are here at the Faculty of Education and Psychology. In addition to the applications, of course I also supervised the work of the Equal Opportunities Officer, with whom we organized the previously mentioned Everyone Helps Day and a lot of charity fundraisers. In addition, I was responsible for dormitory matters, and if students needed any help, they could always turn to me. Due to my position, I was also a member of the board of the Student Union, and here I was able to experience how important the decisions in our hands are day in and day out. This experience added a lot to the work experience of the other members of our Union, as during the reports I was able to listen to the wide range of tasks that some officials perform. Looking back on my more than a year of participation, our presidency has always kept students in mind, and with every



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suggestion, decision, or idea our only priority has been student advocacy. In summary, as president of the Student Welfare Committee, I have learned a lot about what a well-functioning organization is like, and I have managed to gain a wealth of life experience and skills that will hopefully be reflected in all aspects.

My predecessor has already asked me during my committee presidency what I would think of running as President in the next election period. This came as a huge surprise to me, but as an even greater joy, as I would not have thought that I would ever reach a position as high as the presidency of the faculty. I was very happy, and after some deliberation, I thought I would accept this invitation.

Overall goals

I consider it a very important goal to strengthen our communication with students, especially in the current epidemiological situation, so that they are informed as soon as possible about all matters and information that affect them. The Communications Committee will be of great help to us in this, distributing the news to our students through several channels, using the opportunities provided by both Instagram and Facebook. We have made a lot of progress in this regard in recent years, but I believe that learning and gaining experience will never stop, so we will continue to work with the aforementioned committee to seize more and more opportunities in today's online world.

As president of the Student Welfare Committee, I also considered it important that transparency be returned to in all aspects of our work, as this is the primary trust we need to be able to represent our students. I would also like to take this into my presidency and, if possible, improve it, so we want to work with the Audit Committee to develop a platform where our students can get as much information as possible about how our organization works. Of course, we also place great emphasis on our international students, to whom we would like to make all information relevant to them available.

In connection with study matters, the field-specific student advocacy system, which has created a link between students and teachers and management, has been of great help to us so far. The system has proven to be an essential platform, as open-ended questions can be a help to our students that they can reach at any time and are sure to get answers to any problems they may have. In addition to the advocacy system, our students have the opportunity to ask questions directly to officials at other platforms, such as the E-mails provided on our site or our Facebook page. During



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my presidency, I would like these inquiries to be given priority in all respects so that our students have access to the right information as soon as possible.

We would like to continue our well-established relationship with our students in Szombathely, which will be assisted by our Vice President for Szombathely. We consider it important to pass on the PPK identity to them and to have smooth communication between the two training locations. Our presidency plans to visit Szombathely to get a more detailed picture of how they operate there and what help we can give them. A new opportunity for us was the start of psychologist training in Szombathely, which is an extremely big step forward in the life of our faculty. In connection with this, we would like to continue to provide our students with the opportunities that our students in Budapest can enjoy, such as making the courses available and providing insight into faculty life. We would like to further develop this together with our vice-president in Szombathely, assessing the needs and motivation there.

We still want more and more high school students to hear about PPK, so its promotion will continue at various events, such as the Educatio exhibition, given the opportunities the situation offers.

We also consider it important that we could continue to represent our students not only at the faculty level, but also at the university level, so of course we would like to maintain our outstanding relationship with the ELTE SU, which allowed our students to be represented at university level. In connection with this, we would of course like to cooperate with the student unions of the other faculties as well, to maintain the friendship between the faculties. I consider the latter to be particularly important during my presidency, as it will enable us to create a medium that can provide assistance and new opportunities for development, if necessary.

One of our most important organizations in the social life of our faculty is the Animator Circle, with which the Student Union still wants to work in close cooperation, as the Circle also serves as a replacement for our Union, so we consider it important to get to know the allocation as widely as possible. With the President of the Event Organizing Committee and the Animator Coordinator, we would like to see an even better and more efficient system in which, building on the successes of the years so far, it can give even more training opportunities and experience to the trainees. As we cover very important topics in our courses, such as information about our students with special needs, social responsibility or the organization of events, we want to further develop this and provide even more transparent knowledge to our students.

Of course, we believe that an organization can work best when it is constantly evolving and being developed. That is why we consider it important in our Union that the transparency of each other's position, work and tasks should be a priority, and with the help of our vice-president we



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organize team building events, where we can get to know each other better. This is necessary not only because of the friendliness and helpfulness, but also because of the constant transformation in the organization, so we consider it important to have the opportunity to spend a few days with each other at least once every six months, with the help of different exercises. In addition to getting to know not only each other, but also officials from other universities in the country, we would like to continue our participation in the leadership training sessions of the Conference of National Union of Students to develop professionally, but also to further develop our network.

Of course, I think it is an indispensable element that we want to continue to work closely with both the faculty and the university management and to further nurture the positive relationship we have established so far.

I am confident that we will be able to provide the widest possible support to our students and that we will provide them with an advocacy that they can always turn to with confidence.

Changes caused by the epidemic situation

In addition to the program listed above, I consider it important to mention that our Student Union is trying to adapt as much as possible to the changes caused by the current situation. In close cooperation with the Event Organizing Committee, we try to create events that can be held online, for example, we would like to make various home sports or cultural opportunities available to interested students. Restructuring the Animator Training is a topic that is still under discussion, as we do not want the popularity built up over the years to decrease, so together with the President of the Event Organizing Committee and our Animator Coordinator we want to start working on a new structure where we can make this popular training series accessible continuously and smoothly for our students. Of course, our main animator events are expected to be canceled, but we believe that even in this situation, we have the opportunity to organize other types of unusual programs.

Naturally, adapting to the situation also means that we want to communicate much more strongly to our students, so that the information about the problems that arise, both in their studies and in other issues, becomes tangible and transparent at home and online.

Vice President

General

The position of vice president of the Student Union has two main functions. One task is relieving the President and helping their activities, and on the other hand, promoting the organizational development of the Student Union are among the vice president's responsibilities. In my opinion, in order to fulfill my obligations, it is essential to have a broad knowledge of the advocacy work of the SU and the operation of the faculty, and also to be in constant contact with the President of the SU. I want to explain these in detail in my program.

Transparency

I would like to put more emphasis on transparency so that students have as much insight as possible into exactly what advocacy means, how it builds up and who are the parts of the Student Union. A lot of students do not have the opportunity to become a member of the Union's main decision-making body, the Delegate group, and to vote on important issues that affect the operation of the Union. Therefore, I definitely consider it an essential element to be able to communicate this information to students in a more effective way. Reception hours for student officers may also serve part of this purpose. Committee presidents can be visited by our fellow students at the SU office two hours a week, committee members can be visited one hour a week. The rules of university attendance in the current semester allow for the holding of reception classes in person, which has a positive effect on both communication with students and networking among officials. Reception hours can also be found on the website, and we will also respond to inquiries via email.

In addition, it is important to point out that the availability of documentation on the activities of the Student Union on the online interfaces of the SU increases transparency. Both the reports of the board meetings and the documentation of the Meeting of Delegates can be found on the website, so that students can keep up to date. Before the Meeting of Delegates, I collect and standardize the reports of the officials. From this document, members of the delegate assembly can learn about the activities of the organization. I will try to expand and correct the report template, which includes the formal requirements, to make the job easier.



Organizational development

Last year, the team building of the Student Union could not be organized due to epidemiological restrictions. This semester we have the opportunity to make this event, so the conception of the programs has already begun. In order to provide a quality weekend for the participants, we would also like to consult with the Vice President for Organizational Development of ELTE SU. The time spent together (in person), which is an essential element of the team building event, in my opinion has now become even more important as a result of the coronavirus situation. The team building provides an opportunity for officials to get to know each other better, as there are many officials who were only able to meet online last year, there were less opportunities for personal conversation.

There is a lot of fluctuation in the Student Union, and we are trying to integrate the new officials into the organization as soon as possible. I organize a knowledge-sharing training for new members, during which they can gain insight into the operation of the Student Union, get a more detailed picture of the structure of the Faculty, the University Student Union and the national student government organizations.

Mini-talks with officials took place in October, in which the vice president was present in addition to the HÖK President. On these occasions, the officials reflected on the operation of the organization, the difficulties arising from their responsibilities, and also covered the areas to be developed. This is a very important feedback for us, because we can build and develop from them. I would like these mini-talks to take place once every six months.

Contact with Szombathely

I believe that there is a need not only on my part, but also on the part of the Presidency, to become more involved in the lives of PPK students studying in Szombathely, and to strive for cooperation. There have been many requests for the Presidency to visit Szombathely, and I am confident that this will be possible next year.

Internal communication

The development of the Presidency calendar has started earlier, and I still consider its role to be important. Outlook's calendaring feature has also been added to keep track of meetings, and the benefits of Google Calendar have been reconsidered.



Cooperation with the President of PPK SU

Next year will see the start of a larger amendment to the Charter, which we will be managing together with the President. The transformation of our Charter would make the responsibilities of the officials clearer and what our organization represents more transparent.

I have previously served as president of the Audit Committee, so I have been repeatedly confronted with the fact that our Charter do not always use coherent, precise wording. During the process of amending the Charter, I will try to formulate relevant proposals, and I would also like to take part in the administrative work.

Social Assistance

The most important task of our committee is to make social support available for the students, thus helping every student in need to receive financial benefit. In all social support, we strive to do our work in an as student-oriented way as possible. We also aim for students to be properly informed about their opportunities to apply for various grants. To achieve this, we are trying to get the necessary information to as many media outlets as possible, in cooperation with the Communications Committee. Our plans include the creation of a guide which would make the process of the application clearer even for those who would like to apply for the first time for the regular social support. Since the system of social support has been united for several years, it is important that we work with the Social and Scholarship Committee, whereas it is in our common interest to make applications as accessible as possible to everyone. The task of our committee is to assess both regular and exceptional social support, as well as basic benefits, and to solve the problems that arise. We are working with the ELTE University Student Union to ensure that the members of the Social Support Review Committee receive as thorough training as possible, to help the regular social support application process run as smoothly as possible.

Faculty Tenders

Among our faculty tenders, scientific, cultural and sports tenders are announced every semester, by these our students are given the opportunity to organize various events, attend conferences, and establish self-training communities. In addition, in the spring semester an application to be a demonstrator will also be announced. The students, as before, will have to submit their applications through the Neptun system.

Regarding the virus outbreak, it is possible that the current legislation will affect our tenders to a lesser or greater extent, however in line with the regulations we try to support students as much as possible.

In case of the Faculty Tenders, we also aim to provide suitable information on as many platforms as possible about the deadlines and documents to be submitted, so that the possibility of applying reaches everyone in time. We would like to continue our cooperation with the Faculty Scholarship Committee, since the Committee's work is essential in the evaluation and review of the social support applications, because after each application period, but at least in every six month they review possible errors, whether they are related to the interface where the applications can be submitted or to the announcement.



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We are also working with the International Committee to make the calls for tenders available in English for foreign students. An important aspect is to ensure that non-Hungarian students can apply to every tender as well.

Equal opportunities

We also want to ensure that students with special needs have the best possible conditions during their university studies. We try to do our best to make them feel comfortable at the university and not lack anything. The Everybody Helps- Day, which is our tradition, was cancelled in the recent semesters due to the COVID virus, however we wouldn't like to give up on this popular initiative. In this event, students were able to help by visiting various organizations, such as retirement homes and animal shelters. Although our students are very enthusiastically participating in the program, we are working with our equal opportunities referee to get this great initiative to as many people as possible.

Fortunately, there are initiatives that can be implemented even with the virus, for example the "shoe box" campaign or the +1 sandwich week in collaboration with the Budapest Bike Maffia. We would definitely like to organize these events as well.

We are also working with the equal opportunities referee to boost the Volunteer Circle, giving students a continuous opportunity to volunteer.

As soon as we have the opportunity, we would like to organize the blood donation that was planned but was cancelled due to COVID, since it is especially important that we help in the current situation as well.

Dormitory affairs

This year, we would like the information about the dormitories to be more relevant on the website, and we also would like to form a channel where there would be a continuous flow of information between the Dormitory Student Council and us, since this way we could also find solutions more quickly to the student's problems that arise. In this chaotic situation caused by the virus, we find it especially important that students know they can contact us with problems at the e-mail address palyazat@ppkhok.elte.hu.

President of the Economy Committee

General

As in previous years, the Economic Committee has made it its primary objective to grant unimpeded economic operation. This includes the efficient allocation of the budget available to us and its use for the benefit of students. In order to maintain transparency, we would like to provide the event organizers of our faculty (members of the Animator Circle) with as much insight as possible into the background work of the procurements required for the programs.

We would like to continue to support the system of joint spending areas that has worked effectively in the recent past. The organization of the larger events of our faculty (Freshman Camp, Freshman Ball) and the management of our operating budget also benefited due to the introduction of the above-mentioned system. The organization of these major events affects all part-unions, and the standardized processes greatly facilitate the smooth running of the programs and the transparency and comprehensibility of the SAP reports

We would like to continue our efforts to maintain our partnership with school cooperatives, and the conscious use of the budget provided to us would also play a central role.

We intend to continue to work closely with the Economic Committee of ELTE, as their work is essential to ensure the stable and efficient economic operation of our faculty. We intend to participate in the general meetings and leadership training events of the National Union of Students (HÖÖK) this year as well, thus incorporating the useful knowledge base of the country's universities into the committee's operations.

Events

The main drivers for the development of the „PPK identity” are the freshman programs organized by our faculty. The integration of new students into faculty life would receive special attention this year as well. Our primary goal is to ensure the high standard of Freshman Week and Freshman Camp, therefore we would like to start organizing these events at the beginning of the year and continue to offer places to SEK students, thus preserving the integrity of our faculty.

Every year, the Educatio exhibition, our increasingly popular open day in January, and the already traditional ELTEfeszt offer an excellent opportunity to promote our faculty and majors. At these events, we would continue to provide as accurate and detailed information as possible to



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our prospective students and to provide adequate information about both their academic opportunities and faculty life.

The creation of a “PPK identity” would also be a priority in these programs. Our various PR products, which we would like to make for both our Hungarian and foreign students and enrollers, effectively contribute to this.

Faculty issues

In the name of sustainability, our faculty newspaper, PersPeKtíva, has been available online for two years, and our information brochure called Kazynfo has been available online for a year. At the same time, in order to promote the newspaper, we would like to provide a special print edition for our students this year and even make it a tradition in the coming years. In addition, we want to provide PersPeKtíva's editors with the resources to produce PR products from our operating budget on demand.

Office

We would also aim to facilitate efficient work in the new office environment by providing the right tools and equipment. We would also like to maintain a transparent system in our storage room, as this will greatly contribute to the conscious allocation of our operating budget.

President of the Communication Committee

General

Similarly to previous years, the Communications Committee would like to provide the maximum for PPK students this year as well. One of our main tasks is to provide students with fast and comprehensive information from a public, academic, and social point of view. The concept of authenticity and reliability is key to us, which we have successfully developed among our students as well. Facebook and Instagram are the primary information channels that the committee keeps up to date and this will not be different in the future. Our website has been renewed, with greater emphasis on PPK circles, which are an integral part of public life. My plans include a complete redesign of the website. I would like to give it a modern look while remaining within the framework of the identity developed at PPK.

Our offline communication channels are the posters, which we have been actively involved in creating and we would like to continue to develop in this area again this year. This includes creating posters on a study, public life topic or in collaboration with another committee, which students can view at any time on the door of the SU office.

We share the information received from the ELTE, ELTE PPK Communication Office and external inquiries on our Facebook interfaces. We continue to pay special attention to the student groups of the majors, so we can convey accentuated information in a targeted manner, even on the basis of inquiries. On the Instagram interface, I would like to create more space for sharing public events, as in my experience, the best way to gain students' trust is to make the SU more direct to them. In this task, the #mediagroup is our integral help, which operates under the committee. The management of the up-and-coming Instagram interface of Perspektíva is also a common workflow, and we intend to systematize the cooperation with the media team in the future. We want to work closely not only with the Faculty Committees, but also with the Communications Committee of ELTE SU and the ELTE Online team.

#mediagroup

We have been working with almost 20 active people in the recent period, which allows us to develop and innovate, even if we go back to the roots. This year's main goal for the #mediagroup is to videotape the events, in addition to making photo documentation of everything. This tradition began when the circle was founded, but it has worn out of our responsibilities due to the declining membership. We now want to bring this to life with the greatest momentum. At the end of the



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semester or year, we will bring the videos to life in an compilation video with the students, with the goal of strengthening the PPK identity, capturing the community and capturing experiences. At the same time, instead of one annual membership, we would like to announce one every six months and organize more professional days, team building and workshops on demand.

Our future goal is to give members the opportunity not only to document faculty events, but also to participate in press, video, and photography at university events. By doing so, we provide them with a lasting foundation that they can use with our help if they want to take it more seriously in the future.

Perspektíva

Cooperation with the editor-in-chief of the faculty would expand in many ways in the future. Our plans include the publication of the annual Perspektíva magazine. The first few copies will arrive soon, with the editorial staff, the committee and the #mediagroup playing a key role in their design. In this way, we would like to provide the editorial staff with a high-quality background to make the faculty's life more colorful, and our goal is to present the faculty newspaper, which has also been upgraded, to the students with pride.

Our new initiative this year includes organizing a photo exhibition with the #mediagroup and Perspektíva team. According to our plans, we would organize it in the Kazy hall, bringing the students closer to the work of their peers working for the public life of the faculty, and coloring the everyday life of the university with poems and illustrated pictures, while giving space to the members who want to express themselves.

We will help the editorial staff to set up a creative workshop similar to the ELTE Press Workshop, which they would like to hold in the spring for editorial members to get to know each other, develop and train each other. At the literary picnic, we would invite external professional speakers, of course supplementing the event with #mediagroup documentation, which could provide the team with great promotional material during the next membership period.

President of the Foreign Affairs Committee

The two most important goals of our committee are to encourage the mobility of Hungarian students and to integrate international students into faculty life. In order to achieve all this, we distribute a wide range of information to make students aware of their mobility opportunities. We also encourage the organization of several programs and events that strengthen the bond between Hungarian and foreign students, reinforce the position of international students at PPK and increase the interest of students in international exchange opportunities.

Internationalization

Thanks to the Stipendium program (Stipendium Hungaricum) and the English Language University Psychology Programme (ELUP), hundreds of international students study at PPK, which makes our faculty very international. That is why, continuing its work in recent years, the International Committee seeks to provide them with extensive information on the various scholarships and exchanges available to them, and a community in which they are happy to spend one, three or even five years at our faculty. In addition, we consider it important to promote the Erasmus+ mobility program to international students, either on our social media platforms, or on posters and leaflets.

In the event of a transition to further online education, we consider it important that the contact with international students is not lost, and that they have the opportunity to participate in programs that do not necessarily require personal contact. This will be done in collaboration with ESN.

With the cooperation of the International Class Representatives and our PPK mentors, our goal is to organize as many programs as possible, within the framework of which our Hungarian and foreign students could get acquainted. We would rely on the help of the Event Organizing Committee, through translating PPK's events into English.

It is important for us that international students integrate easily and quickly into university life and the Hungarian environment. Thus, we would like to update and supplement the "For foreign students" tab created for them in collaboration with the Communication Committee on the PPK SU website with up-to-date, relevant information, contact information and opportunities during the year.



In the interest of integration, we will continue the tradition of the University Communication event within the framework of the Orientation Days. This training provides international students with an insight into how they can communicate effectively within the university, thereby facilitating their academic integration. In addition, a workshop called Cultural Training is planned to be developed, which would include Hungarian peculiarities, customs and holidays and familiarize foreign students who had just arrived in Hungary with these concepts. In addition, combining the resources already available on the ELTE website and the Hungarian-language Kazynfo information brochure, we consider the creation of an English-language Kazynfo to be an outstanding project.

Furthermore, in cooperation with PersPeKtíva, we would like to provide an opportunity for international students to share their writings, poems, and thoughts in the student journal of ELTE PPK, so we would place great emphasis on it this year together with the editorial staff.

Promoting mobility

In addition to the monthly International Newsletter sent to the International Mailing List, we would like to work with other organizations as additional means of encouraging student mobility, so we plan to cooperate with AEGEE and AIESEC. As part of this, we would promote internships abroad, give lectures, or send out information about them in newsletters at the university. Another proposition of ours is updating the International Compass in collaboration with the International Office, which provides valuable information to outgoing students. There may also be possibilities to organize joint study trips with our partner universities abroad during the year.

One of our main goals is to further develop and promote the International Class Representative system. The essence of this system is to involve the international students who complete their entire studies here in making decisions concerning their own studies and community life. Through the representatives we can gain valuable information about the needs and suggestions of the international students and thus improve the study environment together with the faculty management. In addition to the monthly meetings, representatives can also participate in team building programs. The contact details of the newly recruited international representatives will be updated on the faculty SU website for greater awareness.

We would like to conduct our mentoring program in a more comprehensive way, which further facilitates integration. We continue to encourage international students who complete their entire education here to become mentors and thus, in addition to our Hungarian mentors,



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volunteer to find a solution to the academic or private problems of their mentees. The number of such international mentors is slowly but surely growing. We would also increase the activity on the Hungarian and international Instagram platforms of PPK SU, so that Hungarian students would be aware of our events and opportunities.

We will also pay close attention to existing and new members of the Mentor Program so that they will move confidently in ESN's platforms and have no doubts about tending to their mentoring duties. In this regard, we would like to organize mentor team building events to encourage those who participated in the training during online education and to share our experiences with them.

Co-operation

Although ESN ELTE (Erasmus Student Network), which is responsible for the Mentor Circle, has been operating as an independent organization since 2016, we at PPK still consider it important to maintain our close cooperation. We will also promote the programs they organize to students who have completed their full training here. In order to achieve a smoother and more transparent flow of information and closer collaboration, we would like to assess the sources and platforms from which foreign students are informed, and we also plan to expand the Mentor Circle's know-how guide with up-to-date information. Finally, we encourage closer cooperation with the Animator Circle, other faculties of ELTE and the Szombathely campus through the organization of joint programs.

The basic task of the Event Organizing Committee is to organize the faculty events for the students and to provide the necessary human resources for this. In this school year, we would like to maintain our proven, regular programs, as well as provide space for new ideas. We would like to implement as many of our traditional programs as possible in the usual way, and secondly, if new epidemiological measures come into force, to return to organizing the online events that proved to be successful last year.

Our cooperation with the Communications Committee is particularly important. One of the reasons for this is the needs assessment and the insight into the interest in each event, as we can continuously improve our program offerings based on these. Another reason is the involvement, as the SU Facebook and Instagram page and the PPK Events Facebook page make it easier to reach out to students, share information about specific programs with them, and events that are expected in each month.

Traditional programs

The basic goal of our usual, traditional programs is for students to experience what PPK's social life and identity is like, and to get to know each other better, to make as many relationships with each other as they can. We want to maintain these programs, as well as continuously improve them at the same time so that we can meet as many needs as possible.

The biggest program of the year is the freshman camp, where we have been working with the largest staff, ELTE Szolgáltató Ltd. and security companies for years, so that we can offer the highest quality possible program to first-year students. We were able to successfully start this year's freshman camp and we really hope to be able to start organizing next year's freshman camp during the year.

We would like to keep the freshman week in the same way, which also promotes the orientation and integration of freshmen. This can be a good opportunity for any curious freshmen as well as those who for some reason are unable to attend freshman camp. Fortunately, this year



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we were able to organize the freshman week in the usual way, and we would like to start the next school year with this series of programs.

Culture

Our cultural programs are constantly popular. These include the quiz called PPQ, the Musical Evening, the Poetic Evening, the Board Game Evening, the Soul Films, as well as the Gastro Culture, Beer Tasting, Wine Tasting and the common theater visits. We have already been able to start implementing these offline this school year, so we want to maintain this throughout the school year.

Sport

With regard to sports, our goal is to promote both active and passive sports opportunities at the faculty as much as possible. We started with the usual amount (120) of trainees from previous years. In addition to their training and inauguration, there are also plans to replace the inaugurations of animators and veteran animators that were missed due to the virus situation.

Our plan is to make continuous changes in the Circle with the help of the Organizational Development Circle, as well as to formulate as many proposals and make as many improvements



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as possible on training occasions in order to ensure the most complete training possible and to bounce back into the offline world.

President of the Academic Committee

As in previous years, the most important goal of the Academic Committee this year was to properly inform the students and to represent their interests. We would like to inform the students about all current changes (if possible) in advance, which requires the cooperation of other committees of the Student Union. We consider it important that students turn to us with confidence, so we try our best to achieve this. The committee's program can be divided into representation of interests and three specialized groups: the Delegate Circle, Science and Talent Management, and Teacher Training.

Representation of interests

Our committee would like to continue to cooperate with the staff of the Registrar's Office, to maintain continuous contact with the management of the faculty, and to represent the interests of our faculty in the University Student Union. We will continue to hold regular consultations and detailed discussions with the other committees of the PPK SU in order to keep up to date. We count on the help of the Communications Committee in conveying the deadlines and important announcements and events related to the courses, such as the results of the academic scholarship calculation, the dates of the delegate trainings, current events, etc.

With the participation of the Event Organizing Committee, we would like to continue to participate in the animator trainings, during which we will also share the more important study information with the trainees. We consider this important because newly admitted students meet with animators at the university for the first time, so it is useful for them to be able to serve as a credible source for study questions as well.

Delegate Circle

The Delegate Circle is an external body of the Academic Committee and the ELTE PPK SU, which is the largest human resource of the committee. Its members are delegates who are proficient in all kinds of study issues, so they carry out extremely important activities at events related to the field, such as enrollment, open days, Educatio exhibition. That is why we consider it important to be able to train more new members every year, so we want to hold the delegate trainings in the future both in the autumn and in the spring. During these trainings, applicants are



made 'experts' in academic matters. We also consider the further training of older delegates important, for which we have a Delegate Weekend, which is a three-day team building camp/event where new and older generations can get to know each other and develop professionally together.

The delegates are students who, with their competence and background knowledge, are able to help new and older students. For three years now, the Field-Specific Student Advocacy System (SzHÉK) has been in operation for both undergraduate and graduate students, with senior delegates assisting students in resolving issues. Their work greatly helps the work of the committee, as they also have moderating powers in the official specialization and freshman groups set up on the various community sites, so they can help first-hand with unanswered questions. Students can also look for them with confidence as reliable sources of information. They can organize meetings for the different majors and team building events, which can greatly help students to integrate into the new environment. In the future, our goal is to extend this system to all PPK majors so that SzHÉK representatives can be present in all areas of training.

In order to involve our newly admitted students in public life and to provide them with adequate information about the opportunities available to them, delegates had the opportunity to visit their high school as part of a university central recruitment program, where they can promote their majors, and why one should choose PPK. If possible, we want to keep the tradition of the Roadshow and carry it on.

We would like to prepare for the Educatio exhibition in January with the participation of the Communications Office and the Economic Committee with faculty representation materials, as well as to provide student interest representation, with which we can strengthen our PPK identity with the other faculties of ELTE.

As the newly admitted students have had the opportunity to learn about basic study issues, especially in the freshman camp, this year we consider it extremely important that freshmen also receive the basic study knowledge online that they have been able to acquire at freshman camp so far. This year, the creation of a freshman-know how with a separate QR code and a Neptune-know how contributed to this, which we would like to publish for freshmen and other senior students in the future as well.

Science/Talent Management

We would like to send the call for scientific applications and programs to as many students as possible, such as the demonstrator application, the faculty scientific application, the application for a short-term professional study trip, the Honorácior status and the opportunities provided by



the Illyés Sándor College for Advanced Studies. In addition, we consider it important to promote Scientific Students' Associations (TDK)/ National Scientific Students' Associations (OTDK) events and any conferences that may be held at the faculty. In addition, our goal is to create a more efficient flow of information between the research teams of the institute and the department in the person of our scientific rapporteur.

PPK places great emphasis on scientific life, so we would like to promote opportunities to join research groups. We believe that with this step, we can boost the Science PersPeKtíva, SU's journal with its own ISSN issue, among those interested in publishing. If enough entries are received to publish the volume, the publication would be available online.

The task of the Academic Committee is to announce and evaluate the National Higher Education Scholarship application supported by the Ministry of Human Resources during the spring examination period, which, like last year, we intend to announce and evaluate online this year as well.

Teacher Training

Teacher training also plays a role in the life of the faculty, as the pedagogical-psychological module of the graduate teacher training and the participants in the undivided training is also implemented at PPK. We would like to continue to keep in contact with the faculty leadership and the relevant instructors regarding the „pepsi” module and all other matters related to teacher education. We consider cooperation with the Teacher Training Center to be key. They oversee and organize the studies of students in teacher education, bringing together different disciplines. Our Faculty is already represented at the meetings of the Coordinating Board for Teacher Education, as well as at the Teacher Training and In-Service Training Council. The teacher training officer of the PPK SU performs this task, so s/he can be informed first-hand about matters concerning teacher training. Teacher training at ELTE involves several faculties, so continuous contact between faculty teacher training officers and ELTE SU is very important. In addition to advocacy, the ELTE SU Teacher Education Committee also helps students progress through joint professional projects and brings teachers closer together through other colorful programs.
